Curriculum in the Doctoral School at the University of Silesia from the academic year 2024/2025

The curriculum includes **mandatory modules** common for all doctoral students and **elective modules**, i.e. specialised (related to the specificity of a given discipline and the needs of doctoral students, potentially constituting a continuation of education in a given field) and optional (related to the so-called soft skills or propaedeutic in disciplinary knowledge), **doctoral seminar**, **area seminar** and **professional internships**. The list of elective modules is announced at the beginning of each academic year. A doctoral student may also pursue elective modules outside the University of Silesia, at other Polish and foreign universities.

Some of the modules a doctoral student completes throughout the entire period of study (Table 1), some must be completed in the first year of study (Table 2), some must be completed before the mid-term evaluation (Table 3); the remaining modules can be completed at any time until the end of the study period (Table 4).

The curriculum also takes into account duties that do not require attendance at classes (Table No. 5). The curriculum is prepared separately for doctoral students in scientific disciplines and for those in the arts.
