In 2001, he completed Master's degree at the University of Silesia. In 2008, he obtained a PhD degree in humanities, and a PhD, D.Litt. degree in 2017. In 2002, he was employed at the Institute of History. His research focuses on the history of medieval Scandinavia, development of the ideology of royal power, local historiography, as well as scalds and their poetry.

He is the author and editor of a few monographs and several dozen articles published in Poland and abroad. He is involved with the publication of the Polish-language editions of *Heimskringla* and *Saga of the Jomsvikings*.

He has co-organised several international conferences, including The Jónsborg Conference in 2017. From 2015 to 2019, he was the Deputy Director for Education of the Institute of History. Since 2019, he has been the Deputy Degree Programme Director of the following study programmes: History, Historical Tourism and Central European Historical Studies. He was the coordinator of the Higher Education Student and Staff Mobility Programme, carried out in cooperation with universities in Iceland and Norway.

He has carried out research internships at the University of Iceland in Reykjavik and the University of Oslo. He has been a guest lecturer at over a dozen universities in Poland and abroad. Since 2017, he has been a correspondent member of the Polish-Scandinavian Institute in Copenhagen.
