Roman Soucek	roman.soucek@medschool-hamburg.de	Designing and Evaluating Interventions on Psychological Well-Being	summer	30	4	Today's employees face high demands at work that put their psychological well-being at risk. Based on a framework of resilience in the work context, the course presents interventions to promote the psychological well-being of employees. The interventions and their evaluation will be presented in detail based on our own research. Overall, the goal of this course is to provide students with concrete examples of designing and evaluating interventions in the work context so that they can implement and analyze the effectiveness of their own interventions. The focus of this course is resilience in the work context. Resilience is a person's ability to cope with such situations and is often conceptualized as a bundle of personal resources. However, it is less clear how resilience translates into psychological well-being. We propose a broader approach and present a model of resilience in the work context that considers the levels of individuals, teams, and the organization. We present empirical studies that provide evidence on the effectiveness of resilience interventions as well as on the interplay of personal and organizational resources in their influence on resilient behavior. The course consists of a general introduction to topics such as resilience in the work context and the evaluation of interventions in personnel and organizational psychology. Participants will receive a general introduction to statistical methods relevant to the evaluation of interventions. Finally, many examples of interventions based on our own research will be presented. Exemplary exercises will be carried out with the participants and the evaluation will be explained in detail using the data sets.
