## **Program Description**

Global learning encourages awareness and critical thinking about issues such as law and politics, economy, finance and trade, wealth and poverty, cultural similarities and differences. - 3. Articulate potential solutions or alternatives to global legal problems.
- 4. Communicate effectively and respectfully with people from other cultures, backgrounds, and ethnicities.
