# May 6 2020, in Cieszyn

The clear and steadily growing popularity of various forms of (psycho)therapy seems to result in a slightly paradoxical situation. On one hand, this popularity raises high hopes for growing effectiveness of therapy, but on the other – it causes or even forces to caution, even reservedness, towards new methods and techniques.

As the organising committee, we would like to invite representatives of all disciplines in any way related to psychotherapy to a broad multidisciplinary discussion on the scientific output in the field of psychotherapy and psychotherapeutic practice. What we expect are motifs appearing at possibly many levels of reflection:

the (meta)theoretic, methodological and methodical. Special attention will be paid to the forms, methods and techniques of children psychotherapy.

### During the discussion, we hope:

- to make a reconstruction of both the undisputable "hard core" of forms, methods or techniques of psychotherapy and their more flexible "soft peripheries";
- to index major controversies around them;
- to index the major factors responsible for low effectiveness of psychotherapy or even its iatrogenic character.
- bring out what is responsible for the healing and positive effects of therapy, regardless of its modality and school

## We attach these goals to the following thematic blocks:

- necessary relationships: prevention diagnosis therapy
- theoretical foundations of psychotherapy: vision of the disease and its mechanisms vision of therapeutic actions
- therapist: guardian, guide, servant, creator, human behavior engineer?
- psychotherapy: internal differentiation of methods and forms
- a child as a subject of psychotherapy
- hardship, drama, existential tragedy as a therapeutic challenge
- different schools and modalities to the same client / patient or problem
- "soft peripheries" of (psycho)therapy: pedagogical therapy, sociotherapy, other types of therapy ...
- systemic family therapy: ME YOU WE
- paradoxical therapy: necessary risk or bravado?
- everyday therapy: when your neighbor is your naïve therapist ...
- development (in) therapy: opportunity or necessity?
- supervision: a necessary evil, a lifeline or a luxury?
- art in psychotherapy: occupational therapy or contact with Great Art?
- philosophia magistra vitae: necessity or detachment reality?
- an autotherapy: to paddle one's on canoe alone
- iatrogenia: an accident at work, an error of art or ... an attribute of given approach or modality?
